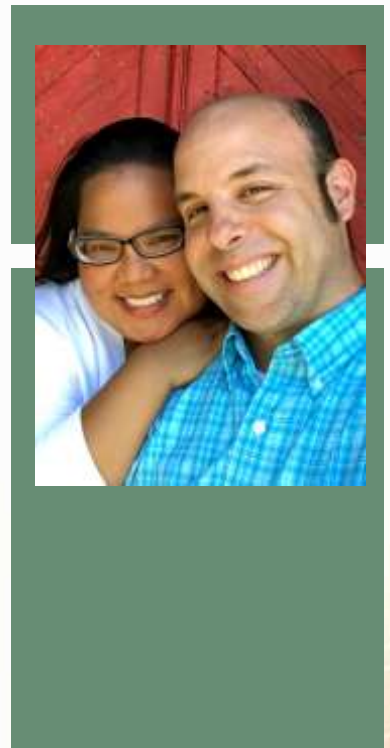
Ryan's Ramblings

Thanksgiving Celebration

All three churches from Brandon, Sun City Center and Dover got together to celebrate Thanksgiving. A moment to rejoice and give thanks to our God for all of the blessings given to us in 2018. As we remember the Pilgrims and the Wampanoag Indians who started this great tradition not only to share a meal but to give thanks to someone who is bigger than life, our Lord Christ Jesus. 1621 was the first Thanksgiving celebration and today this nation and some Latin American countries observe this special holiday. As the churches met in Dover both adult and children choirs sang songs, families testified of the greatness of God, Children made crafts, finally sharing a meal with each family present. The Apostle Paul said in 1 Thesalonians 5:16-18 "Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus."

Pastor's Special Trip to Guyana

Pastor Roberto and Yamiley went on special trip to the country of Guyana to support Yamiley's mother, Norma with her travel documents approval process at the US consulate in Guyana. At the moment there no direct diplomatic channels between the US and Cuba. Any persons seeking travel visas from Cuba to the United States will have travel to Guyana or other countries with diplomatic channels with United States and Cuba. Once in Guyana our pastor stayed in a hotel with a Hispanic Mission serving many people from different countries. Many of these people were running from oppressive governments, some were undocumented working to support their families. Others were there waiting and hoping to be granted a travel visa to the United States as was Pastor Yamiley's mother. People were sent to see Pastor Chaple for prayers as they await answers on the approval process. The church here in the States were in prayer mode from the date the pastors left until they returned November 17th. At every prayer meeting our pastor were covered in prayer. The Church was in Spiritual warfare; going to bed we prayed, getting up we prayed, we prayed via telephone, prayer chains. The Apostle Paul said: "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. 7 And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." Philippians 4:6-7

When the news came out that Pastor Yamiley's mother was granted the US resident card known as the "green card" the church rejoiced because our prayers are being answered not by the man upstairs as known in some circles but by our God, Jesus Christ.

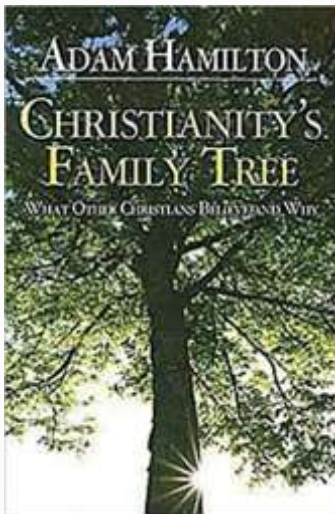

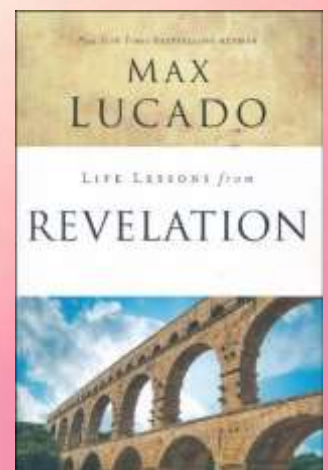

The cost of a single meal?



Unfortunately, we had a loss of (\$25,874) for the month of November. Our cumulative shortfall for the year of 2018 is (\$119,420). While we anticipate December to a positive month financially, the deficient is still a daunting number. It has been suggested that if everyone would prayerfully considered contributing an extra \$5 a week or \$20 per month to the general operating fund, our church would be in a strong financial position.
