# FROM THE OFFICE

## From Finance



Last month I mentioned in this space the link between Stewardship and Discipleship, that is, to be a disciple you must also be a steward. As John Wesley put it in his explanatory notes on Luke 16:12 (the parable of the Unjust Steward):

*None of these temporal things are yours: you are only stewards of them, not proprietors: God is the proprietor of all; he lodges them in your hands for a season: but still they are his property. ... If your steward uses any part of your estate (so called in the language of men) any farther or any otherwise than you direct, he is a knave: he has neither conscience nor honour. Neither have you either one or the other, if you use any part of that estate, which is in truth God's, not yours, any otherwise than he directs.*

I think what Wesley is saying is that God has entrusted us with everything we have and everything we are: He is the owner and we are His stewards. Just as if someone were to misuse our things, we would think them to be a scoundrel, without honor or conscience, so must God think of us when we choose to not honor His will with His stuff.

In his sermon “On the Use of Money”, Wesley implores us to earn, save and give as much as we can:

**Earn as much as we can** without doing harm to ourselves or our neighbor in mind, body or spirit. To go about our daily business without any graft or corruption, or enabling others in harmful pursuits. By using all our

skill and knowledge to do everything in a way that will bring honor to God.

**Save as much as we can**, not by hoarding, or storing away, but by eliminating frivolous spending and self-indulgence. What good is it to work hard and earn more and save more if we waste it on things that do not bring honor to God?

**Give as much as we can**, first by taking care of ourselves and our family, then our fellow Christians, and then to things that help strangers, and thus glorify God. What good is it to earn and save, if we don't do something with those resources that bring honor and glory to God, the actual owner of everything?

Jesus gives us a great example in the story of the Good Samaritan. Read Luke 10:25-37. We see the Samaritan doing all three of these things with his time, his talents and his treasure. He travels into places he is not necessarily welcome because of his country of origin, to do business and earn a living. But he doesn't put his business above the well-being of a stranger, he takes a day to stop and tend to the injured man. He used his skills to tend the man's wounds himself and gave money to the inn keeper for the stranger's continued care. Pretty good example.

This month try looking for those places you can earn or save a little more by cutting back on something and so sacrifice a little to give a little more to God to further His Kingdom. These things bring Glory to Him, and lay up treasures for us in Heaven!

## UMCSCC CHILDREN'S MINISTRY


Thank you so much for your continued support of our children's ministry. With your support we have been able to accomplish many great things in 2019 and we look forward to what God has in store for 2020.

## **FROM OUR ASSOCIATE DIRECTOR OF MUSIC**

### ***How do I choose organ music for our services?***

This is the first church where I've had the ability to choose music for the whole year. I just submitted my plans to Jeff so he can input the material for each week.

I try to listen to the congregation and if someone makes a suggestion that I know or can learn, I will program it and let them know when it will be played.

I don't believe in playing things that I don't like, I also try to choose things that people have liked in the past and/or that have nice tunes that will be attractive to the congregation. Time is also an issue, I try for less than three minutes for the prelude and endeavor to finish when the clergy sit down.

Postludes don't have the same time constraints but volume is an issue. Generally these are more active than preludes. People seem to like pieces with a nice tune and an interesting texture. We hold the volume back at the beginning so those who have an aversion to the brighter stops can find their way to the exits while those who enjoy more vigorous organ music can stay and listen.

We try to balance different schools of organ music. We have trumpet tunes that everyone will know, significant repertoire from the last three hundred years, etc. I avoid things that have clashing harmony and are not appropriate for our congregation. There are also certain composers that I will never feature; if I don't like them, you probably won't either!

If there is something that you would like to hear, please let me know and I'll be glad to see what I can do!

# From the *Director of Worship Arts*


In one of my devotions today I read the following, and I found that it really ‘rang true’...

*People are attracted to Christ more than they are persuaded to Him. They’re attracted by the love of God shown through the people who claim to follow Him. And they won’t care what we know until they first know that we care.* [Rick Warren’s 40 Days of Love]

In last month’s Forward in Faith article I talked about how the word is out about our Church – that it is simply the BEST family of faith around. I’d like to revise that a bit to say that it is the MOST LOVING family of faith around and, if that’s not entirely true, I believe we need to fix that ‘right quick’ (as I’ve heard folks in Kentucky say)!

In two of his fine February sermons, Pastor Charlie reminded us that WE are the body of Christ, that WE are better together, and that WE are the light of the world. God is indeed working through this Church to build His Kingdom here in South Shore. And sometimes we just need to ‘get out of His way’ to help make this a reality, but most of the time we must work on the most important part of our Christian walk – LOVING OTHERS. I think... no, I know that this Church family has grown [by over 1,000 in the last five years!] because we have done a good job of sharing His love with our weekend visitors, our friends & family, and our community.

Could we do better? I think you know the answer to that one. In the aforementioned devotion, Rick gives us three good ideas. First, we can work at making our present relationships



more loving. This may involve some simple changes in attitude, but it also may involve much tougher changes like offering forgiveness and seeking reconciliation. Second and logically, we should increase our number of relationships. Finally, he points out that another way to spell LOVE is T-I-M-E. To love Jesus, you’ve got to spend TIME with Him, and to love others you’ve got to find the TIME to spend with them as well. In summary, Rick says:

*Can you imagine what would happen if everyone in the church loved like this – if we all committed ourselves to acting in love and giving our time unselfishly so that people could experience a taste of how much God loves them? It would change the world [and] it would grow God’s Kingdom.*

Isn’t that what ‘church’ is really supposed to be about? Blessings and LOVE to all!

## FROM OUR DISASTER RESPONSE TEAM

It is winter in Florida and yes, we are still going on mission trips to follow-up on Hurricane Irma (2017) and Hurricane Michael (2018). Recovery efforts continue from these 2 devastating hurricanes. From January 21-26 sixteen members of the DRT went to Immokalee in the Florida Everglades to do a variety of repair work. Members were grouped into four teams, each with specific tasks. One team worked on plumbing, flooring, and shower installation. Another team fixed overhangs and put down flooring. The third team caulked and painted on the outside of a house. A fourth team tarped over a roof. A final job involved replacing flooring in a trailer. This was not every person's idea of a vacation, but it was rewarding and much was accomplished! Kudos to all who went.

From February 16-21 three members of the DRT went to Apalachicola. They went to work on electricity, plumbing, and carpentry. They also went to install three showers to replace portable showers that had to be relocated. Remember, our meetings are on the second Wednesday of the month at 1:00 p.m. in Room 19. Our next meeting is March 11.

## UMCSCC hosts EMPTY BOWLS EVENT




United Methodist Church of Sun City Center recently hosted its first ever "Empty Bowl" project. Empty bowl is an international event to raise funds to serve the food deprived, so that no one goes to bed with an empty "bowl". In our county, South Hillsborough, over 65% of public school students receive free school meals. One in four children in the Tampa Bay area struggle with hunger. These children typically rely on free or reduced cost school lunches to fulfill their daily nutrition needs, however, when school stops for weekends or breaks so do the children's meals.


Our Empty Bowl event was the inspiration and dream of Joanie Frantz, Team Leader of our Social Needs Ministry, which also ministers to the homeless, five elementary schools, one middle school and one high school, as well as a trailer park, all in the local area, with help with food, uniforms, underwear, socks,

blankets, etc. For Empty Bowl, Joanie recruited two local pottery clubs (Sun City Center and Kings Point Pottery Clubs) to design and paint 530 beautiful bowls which they donated to the event. The day of the event, each guest chose a bowl and was served a cup of soup, a piece of bread and ordinary tap water. The charge for tickets was \$15.00. Volunteers went to local businesses to get both monetary and food contributions. The event was scheduled from 11 am – 2 pm. Four hundred and fifty three attended on an "open house" basis. An estimated 75% of those attending were from the community, not church membership. Colorful "Welcome" cards were distributed giving church service times, and all those attending will be followed up with more information of church events and opportunities.


To date this event has raised \$11,169 to help feed the hungry in our area!


